Context

Greek philosopher Heraclitus (b. 535BC) is often credited with coining the famous cliché, "the only constant is change." Heraclitus was right, but only for human experience. It is true that human life always changes, but, according to the Bible, God does not. He is unchanging, immutable. As Psalm 46 will show, God is the solid rock upon which we stand even when everything changes.

Study Questions

Read Psalm 46:1-11

1. How does the Psalmist describe God (46:1)?
2. How does God give His people stability in the midst of life (46:2-3)?
3. Why can God's people be joyful in the midst of tumultuous circumstances (46:4-7)?
4. Why should God's people remember what He has done (46:8-9)?
5. What does God command His people to do (46:10-11)?

Application Questions

1. What is intimidating about the fact that life is always in flux? How has your faith kept you steady in turbulent times?
2. What are some things that people typically settle for instead of finding joy in God? How can you avoid those things this week?
3. Describe a time that God was faithful to you. How can reflecting on that experience help you the next time you face trying circumstances?
4. Why is stillness so important for the Christian life? What is the ratio of time you spend in God's Word vs. consuming other content? How can you even that ratio out more?
